I have heard a number of comments and seen a few statements and videos which all contend that 2016 was a horrible year and how 2017 will be so much better. I could easily spend my brief time here on this page, and in my life complaining about the things I do not appreciate about the past year. For that matter, I could probably do the same about ANY year. Instead, I challenged myself to consider what I loved about 2016, and I quickly thought about these verses. Here is why they came to mind.

Christmas is always a busy season. In fact, I have stated that everything from Halloween to Christmas is a blur for me. This year was no different. The time flew by incredibly fast, and looking back—just a couple of days before Christmas—I can once again say it was frenetic, but I would not trade these times for anything else. Perhaps I have been too conservative in my statements. The entire year was filled with moments of wonder as God provided brothers and sisters in Christ who challenged me to look past the struggles of the entire year.

Lighthouse came to life: When we started rehearsing as a praise team more than a year ago, I had to question my own sanity. In the middle of chemotherapy, side-effects of pain and being cold, to go along with general fatigue, I wondered if this was really the time to start a praise team. This year, the praise team grew and stabilized, Lighthouse started worship services, and now we have lots of people who regularly worship with us. God is good!

Coffee House and Music Lounge was born: When V said to me, "We should start a coffee house." I had no idea what that meant or how to accomplish this. Four months into the project, we are covering costs, welcoming new artists to sing, and enjoying 30-50 people per week who want to have a cup of coffee, some pastries, and enjoy the music. Many of these people are joining us for worship. Many more are seeing that our church is different than they expected.

Littlest Angels shared with other children: I heard from more than one family how children were using their allowances, savings, and piggy banks to donate funds toward our Helping St. Nicholas campaign. Today we gave away 100 backpacks with books, fruit, snacks, candy and a Christmas Story Cube. These backpacks will soon be in the hands of children and middle school students who do not expect or receive much for Christmas.

Reverse Advent Calendars helped the homeless: Today was also delivered 70 silver boxes to a homeless shelter. Each box had approximately 21 items to help a homeless person with personal needs. Another 9 boxes were given to Pastor Pesa who will distribute these to people who never make it to the homeless shelter. I watched as people came to the office or to church just to pick up a box so they could participate. We helped people we would never meet, but we also followed the path of Jesus, trusting that God will do more than we can imagine with our gifts.

Forte taught children music, the choir sang, preschoolers graduated, the bell choir rang, shut-ins received Happy Mail, and Life Tree encouraged conversations. Recyclables, pocket change and baked goods were turned into mission funds, dinners were hosted and lunches were served, our youth group invited another group and travelled to New Orleans to worship with 25,000 Christians. Buildings were repaired and instruments were tuned. Hospitality for foreign students and people being treated at Stanford were offered for free. Groups of people came together to walk, knit, pray, and enjoy friendship. What have I missed? Please fill in the gaps. I am sure you can think of something I have missed. Was it flowers donated or meals delivered? Was it preparing coffee hour or birthday cards, or Monday letters or books to people grieving? Did you count the offering or pray for those in need? So many things happened in 2016 and though I cannot remember all of them, one word comes to mind...THANKFUL.

I give thanks for all of you and your witness of Jesus, a loving savior who gave us eternal life. I give thanks for your energy, ideas and time. Most of all, I give thanks for the love and forgiveness you offer to others because Jesus has loved and forgiven you first.

Happy New Year. May 2017 be just as filled and fulfilling.

Bible Basics by Pastor Tom Norris

8 Important Prayers from the Bible

Prayer is a subject that is, well... fraught.

Some people find it easy. Some don't. Some pray very frequently. Some don't.

Is there a "right" way to pray? Some say so. Is it "wrong" to pray prayers that are written down? Again, some say so.

Does God "change his mind" because we pray? And how would that work, given all the interactions of all the people in the world? Does that mean that prayers change the future in many ways? And what if it would change the future in a way harmful to someone else? Is that the reason some prayers are "answered" and others aren't? Would it even be possible for a prayer to be answered positively for one person without other negative future consequences for someone else?

This winter's Wednesday Bible study will examine "8 Important Prayers from the Bible." We'll look at each of the prayers listed below in turn, and ask a number of questions including:

- What does the person offering the prayer think about God?
- What does that person want God to do?
- What might God want us to understand about Himself by having this prayer recorded in Scripture?
- How might God want to shape the faith of people who pray like this?
- How might it be possible for us to pray this way today?

Here are the prayers we'll be studying and the dates for each:

- January 4: Psalm 51
- January 11: Psalm 139
- January 18: Matthew 6:5-13
- January 25: John 17:11
- February 1: Acts 7:55-59
- February 8: Ephesians 1:15-23
- February 15: Ephesians 3:14-20
- February 22: Philippians 4:6-7

The class meets **on Wednesday evenings** at **6:30** in a **classroom** off of the **Family Center**. I hope you'll consider joining us.

Deaconess Carol Lee Halter has served as an evangelistic missionary among the Chinese people in Hong Kong since 1981. From 1969 to 1981, Carol served as a missionary with the Chinese Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit in San Francisco, CA. For three years before that, she was a volunteer missionary in Hong Kong.

Carol does humanitarian, evangelistic and educational work among the young, the elderly and the poor Chinese people who live in Hong Kong. Her prayer is that all Chinese people will hear the saving Gospel of Jesus Christ - especially from each other. Fluent in both Mandarin and Cantonese, Carol nurtures and trains Chinese people to grow in Christ and to share the Gospel by holding educational and evangelism seminars and Bible classes, and by counseling individuals.


Save the date for the weekend of **January 15th**. We are hoping to take our youth on a getaway snow weekend. More details to follow.

"The Essentials of Effective Prayer"


